Good communication is central to a successful security training program. It can help generate interest from your developers while also keeping them in the loop with what's going on and what is expected from them.

The previous page shows an example of a quick reminder you can send to your teams if there is an upcoming completion date for a course you've assigned.

This can range from 1-2 weeks, depending on the course content, but it should be sent with enough time for your developers to actually complete the course before the closing date.

This type of messaging is recommended if your course has a specific completion date, but for open or ongoing courses, you might choose not to send reminders as frequently or at all.

It's worth encouraging developers to participate in the courses program by highlighting the fact that the knowledge and experience gained from Courses also offers them a significant opportunity to take part in some personal career growth, something they don't often get to do.

There's a lot of room to adjust information to make it relevant to your organization and the path your security program is on.

A few things to keep in mind when creating communications:

- **Be clear** - Provide clear expectations and directions
- **Be concise** - Avoid information overload or too many subjects in one message
- **Be informative** - Offer relevant and helpful information Devs need
- **Be transparent** - Be open with your teams about what's happening and why
- **Be empathetic** - Show that you understand your Dev's busy schedules

Keeping these things in mind will help you focus on the key information behind the message you intend to share with your teams.
