Good communication is central to a successful security training program. It can help generate interest from your developers while also keeping them in the loop with what's going on and what is expected from them.

The previous page shows an example of how you might choose to introduce the Secure Code Warrior platform. This is just one example, but it's by no means the only way to make this type of announcement.

If an introductory Tournament doesn't apply to your program or you'd prefer to send out a separate message around Tournaments, you can always leave that part out.

The main purpose of this message is to encourage developers and team leaders to login to the platform and start exploring.

It's also good to let them know that your company's new security training program isn't just for the company benefit, but also for the benefit of each developer that participates.

There's a lot of room to adjust information to make it relevant to your specific organization.

A few things to keep in mind when creating communications:

- **Be clear** - Provide clear expectations and directions
- **Be concise** - Avoid information overload or too many subjects in one message
- **Be informative** - Offer relevant and helpful information Devs need
- **Be transparent** - Be open with your teams about what's happening and why
- **Be empathetic** - Show that you understand your Dev's busy schedules

Keeping these things in mind will help you lockdown the key information behind the message you intend to share with your teams.
