Good communication is central to a successful security training program. It can help generate interest from your developers while also keeping them in the loop with what's going on and what is expected from them.

The previous page shows an example of how you can demonstrate the reasoning behind your company's choice of training program and the ways it can be beneficial to individual developers. This is one sample we use, but it's by no means the only way.

This type of message should help explain how the platform can benefit your development teams and their future career paths, while also encouraging them to look around in the platform for something they might find interesting.

Reminding your developers that, while there will be training recommendations and Courses to complete, they will still have access to the whole platform after completing any mandatory training activities. Before sending this type of communication, consider setting up an information page on your team or organization's internal knowledge base or intranet so that interested developers can read more at their own leisure.

There's a lot of room to adjust information to make it relevant to your organization and the path your security program is on.

A few things to keep in mind when creating communications:

- **Be clear** - Provide clear expectations and directions
- **Be concise** - Avoid information overload or too many subjects in one message
- **Be informative** - Offer relevant and helpful information Devs need
- **Be transparent** - Be open with your teams about what's happening and why
- **Be empathetic** - Show that you understand your Dev's busy schedules

Keeping these things in mind will help you lockdown the key information behind the message you intend to share with your teams.
